Minutes of the Meeting held on Friday 10th January 2020 in the Community Centre, Recreation Close, Clowne starting at 6.00pm

121/19 Apologies for Absence

Apologies were received from Cllrs B Bosworth, N Hoy and N Yewman

122/19 Confirmation that Attendance Register has been signed

Confirmed by all present.

123/19 Notification of Unregistered Declarations of Personal or Pecuniary Interest

Cllrs Arthur and Salt declared interests in Planning (Item)

124/19 Notification of Consideration of a Dispensation

None received.

125/19 Minutes of Previous Meetings

It was RESOLVED to consider the outstanding minutes at the next meeting.

126/19 Confirmation of Dates for future Meetings

- (a) Full Council - It was noted that the following dates for Full Council Meetings have already been agreed - 07.02.20, 06.03.20, 03.04.20 and 08.05.20. It was RESOLVED to hold an addition meeting on Friday 17th January 2020 at the Community Centre at 6.00pm
- (b) Committees – It was RESOLVED that the HR Committee will meet on Monday 20th January 2020 at 6.30 in the Community Centre, the Finance Committee will meet on Tuesday 21st January 2020 at 6.00pm in the Community Centre, the Allotments Committee will meet on Thursday 23rd January 2020 at 6.00pm in the Community Centre and the Events Committee will meet on Friday 24th January 2020 at 6.00pm in the Community Centre.
- (c) Clowne and Barlborough Joint Burial Committee- It was RESOLVED to arrange a meeting for this Committee at a later date. It was noted that some tree work has been carried out at the cemetery by Western Power so that branches do not touch the power lines.

127/19 Parishioner's Forum

Standing Orders were suspended to allow members of the Public to Speak.



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Councillors were reminded that they had agreed that wildflower seeds would be set on the verges and that now was the time for the preparation work to be undertaken

Litter and fly tipping were discussed and the possibility of being able to issue on the spot fines was suggested.

It was noted that Membership of the Youth Club at Barlborough was open to all.

Councillors were asked about the provision of Seats and Bins at Mill Street.

Members of the Public were reminded that local groups can apply for grant funding from the Council.

Questions were raised about the proposed mobile CCTV cameras and it was agreed to discuss this matter further with the police.

It was reported that the notice board will be put up soon.

Councillors agreed to look into the possibility of having a social media presence.

Parking issues were raised again with particular problems being reported on Kings Street and near the TSB. Concerns were expressed that damage is being done to the verges and emergency vehicles will not be able to get through. It was agreed to raise the matter with DCC Highways and the Police.

Concerns were expressed about the proposed compulsory purchase of a strip of land at Rood Lane. Cllr Bailey and Cllr Salt declared an interest in matters relating to planning and left the meeting. It was noted that Bolsover District Council are proposing to purchase a strip of land which will enable them to access land already in their ownership on which they propose to build a large number of houses. The proposal would result in two existing properties being demolished. Cllr Bailey and Cllr Salt re-joined the meeting.

Concerns were expressed about large and overhanging trees at Brookhill.

It was noted that some tree work has been carried out by Western Power at the cemetery.

Standing Orders were resumed.

129/19 Chairs Report

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130/19 Items Raised by Councillors for Consideration

- (a) Feasibility Report – Cllr Salt gave details of his investigations into the feasibility of providing a Skate Park. It was RESOLVED to discuss this matter at the next meeting.
- (b) Cllr Salt – Provisions for Wildlife- Cllr Salt gave details of projects in other areas where the tops of bus shelters are developed to provide a habitat for wildlife and in particular bees. It was RESOLVED to investigate this idea further and discuss at the next meeting
- (c) Cllr Dixon – Speeding Traffic – Cllr Dixon expressed concern about speeding traffic and reported that a recent speed check at Barlborough had recorded 69 vehicles exceeding the speed limit. Community Speed Watch was discussed and Cllr Walker reported on his discussions with the police on this matter. It was RESOLVED to discuss the matter further at the next meeting.
