

NOTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CLOWNE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 6TH JANUARY 2014 IN THE MEETING ROOM, CLOWNE COMMUNITY CENTRE, VILLA PARK, CLOWNE COMMENCING 6.45PM

IN ATTENDANCE: 5 members of the public; Cty Cllr A. Western, DCC; PCSO Fox & PCSO Wardle, Derbyshire Constabulary and D.E.Cameron (Clerk).

POLICE REPORT

The Chairman welcomed PCSO Fox and PCSO Wardle to the meeting. PCSO Fox presented the monthly crime figures for December 2013.

It was noted that the crime figures had increased since November and were UP on numbers from December 2012.

PCSO Fox added that that the Police Priority Profile would remain as previous; The Sidings Skate park, Mill Street & Rectory Road area. There had been several reports for police service to this area with an increased amount of nuisance and antisocial behavior.

The Chairman asked for the police to patrol the skate park area frequently and feed back to the young people, that the continual anti-social behaviour, vandalism and inappropriate behaviour will not be tolerated and this would be deferred for further discussion.

The police representatives explained that the majority of young people using the skate park were responsible and using the park for its intention. She added that the minority were acting irresponsibly, and causing the damage.

Members asked the police to monitor the problems in the area and the Parish Council would address at a later date.

Cty Cllr Western suggested a community 'clean-up' project which could involve the local young people in taking responsibility and management of use of the skate park. Cllr Western added that she would discuss this project initiative with Heritage High School.

COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT

The Chairman welcomed Cty Cllr Western to the meeting.

Cllr Western continued and explained further about a possible 'Clean Up Day' for areas within the community. The project could be joint partnership initiative involving DCC, BDC, local schools, youth service, etc. with sponsorship being sought from local businesses (Wilko, Tesco, Aldi etc). Cllr Western would report back.

Cllr Western continued to express her concerns regarding the reduction in government funding and the cuts being imposed locally to services and the impact that these cuts would have over the next 5 years. She added that she would not accept these changes easily and would look to protect services to the most vulnerable people. She would strive to maintain the premium services and look after areas of greatest need and this would be addressed with effective financial management of the resources available.

Cllr Western explained that the cuts would effect NHS, Police Authority and Fire & Rescue Authority with an overall £500m reduction in public services.

Cllr Western added that ongoing consultations on securing services would continue.

DECLARATION OF INTEREST

230/13 It was confirmed that the Declaration of Interest Book had been signed.

APOLOGIES

231/13 Apologies for absence were submitted on behalf of Cllrs Haywood, Hendry, Patrick & Patterson.

232/13 Resolved that the Minutes of the Clowne Parish Council meeting held on Monday 2nd December 2013 be approved and adopted and signed as a true record.

ACTION FROM THE PUBLIC FORUM

233/13 The Chairman reported on the various items of business relating to BDC, DCC and the police which had been discussed and would be forwarded onto the relevant Departments.

234/13 Resolved that Chesterfield College be contacted regarding the fallen tree on car park land behind The Church Hall building on Rectory Road, Clowne. The tree has fallen across the stream causing a blockage to the waterway and obstructing the flow of the stream. The backlog of debris had resulted in subsequent partial flooding.

The Chairman shared comments he had received on the success of the events/activities with Members of the Parish Council. He felt that it was a positive way to start 2014 with parishioners praising The Centre for encouraging participation and providing family friendly events & activities.

It was recommended that CPC Events Meeting be arranged to discuss an Event Planner for 2014. (Date agreed: Mon 20/01/14).

It was suggested that a statement of scheduled events be prepared for discussion. It was agreed that a poster of all the annual events etc. be prepared and displayed in The Centre to showcase the Councils community involvement.

CORRESPONDENCE/ ITEMS TO THE COUNCIL

235/13 Circulars had been received from Age UK Derby & Derbyshire: Information on new Befriending Scheme in Bolsover. It was resolved that information be made available and displayed.

236/13 Resolved to defer item to Agenda Item 13 – EXEMPT for further discussion.
Update re: repairs to property – Festive Illuminations 2013/14

237/13 An application for funding had been received from R.A.S.C.A.L.S . It was noted that this was an out-of-area funding application. It was confirmed that there was currently no available funds and therefore Members rejected the grant application.

238/13 The Sidings Skate Park. A Member expressed his concerns for the increasing amount of anti-social behaviour, nuisance and vandalism currently happening at the skate park area. He explained that there were several areas of disrepair of the skate park boards, under boards and ramps which required repair. Members agreed that the area was currently costing the Parish Council in manpower and ongoing maintenance and this needed to be addressed in line with current usage. It was resolved that costings be sought from Rhino Ramps for overall repairs & damage and ask for a safety inspection of the area and their recommendations. (Look at new types of boards which reduce constant damage). Members agreed that continual mis-use of the facility would result in the Council to consider the future of the facility.

PLANNING

Cllr Connerton & Smith declared an interest and took no part in discussion and left the room.

241/13 APPLICATION 13/00465/FUL Erection of outbuilding to rear comprising swimming pool and associated facilities @ 3 Gapsick Lane, Clowne for Mr. P Howard. Member recommended that the development be respectful of neighbouring properties in design and impact and not impose on privacy of neighbouring properties.

242/13 APPLICATION 13/00530/FUL Erection of single storey dwelling @ land to the side of 24 Rhodes Cottages, Clowne for Mr. Chapman. Members continued with their previous comments (see Minute 186/13)

- Impact on neighbouring properties
- Adequate off road car parking provision
- Poor Access for emergency services, refuse collection etc.
- Proposed size of property

243/13 APPLICATION for Tree Preservation Order 13/00536/TPO Tree works to 2 sycamore trees, 1 ash tree & 3 lime trees @ Churchfields Farm, Church Street, Clowne for Mr. Parsons. NO COMMENTS.

244/13 APPLICATION 13/00532/FUL Vehicular access @ 109 Creswell Road, Clowne for Mr. Hardwick. Members expressed concerns regarding the access onto a very busy highway and request consultation with DCC Highways.

245/13 APPLICATION 13/00513/FUL Single storey extension to rear/side dwelling, re-roof and re-render @39 Brook Hill, Clowne for Mr. & Mrs. Ashley. Requires adequate of road car parking provision.

246/13 APPLICATION 13/00501/FUL Demolition of existing mining institution building (Unlisted building in Clowne Conservation Area) and erection of 4 No. apartments and 2 No. houses with associated works @ the Former Clowne Mining & Technical Institute, Rectory Road, Clowne. Members expressed concerns over the loss of a building of some local history. The Chairman asked for parishioners wishing to object to the proposals to make their objections/intentions to BDC Planning Dept.

247/13 APPLICATION 13/00510/OUT Residential development @land to the rear of 44 Mitchell Street, Clowne for Mr. & Mrs. Kasprzycki. Members expressed concerns as follows:

- Increased vehicular movement onto a busy, heavily congested road
- Increased density and volume of traffic
- Poor access
- Possible "backland planning"
