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	<p>planted each summer and winter and would save money in the long run.</p> <p>The sleepers that were removed from Mill Green Way could be reused somewhere else like the allotments for example.</p> <p>Behind the planting she advocated erecting some sort of decorative community mural a possible theme could be a tribute to the NHS and other Key Workers. This could capture lockdown memories of local people.</p> <p>Schools and other local groups could be involved in the design working with a mural artist.</p> <p>Bolsover District Council own the fence on Mill Green Way so they would need to approve any proposed works and section 106 public art funding for Clowne could potentially be used to fund these works.</p> <p>Councillor Bosworth, whilst seeing the relevance and importance of having visual support for the fantastic work of the NHS and key workers during the current pandemic, was worried that in 5 years' time it may have lost some of its current relevance and require incur further costs to repaint a different mural.</p> <p>The Clerk estimated the cost of this scheme could be as much as £5000.
